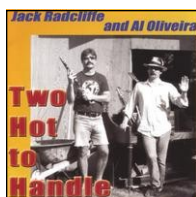


Radcliffe & Oliveira:

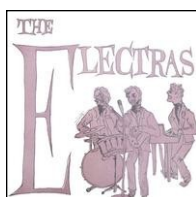


Sen. Kerry & The Electras:

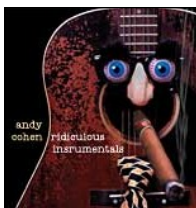


Andy Cohen:

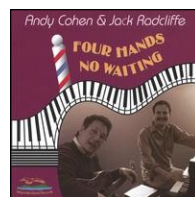


Cohen & Radcliffe:

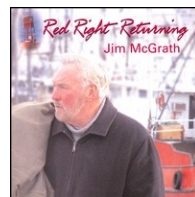


Jim McGrath:

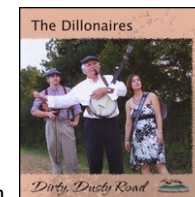


The Dillonaires:

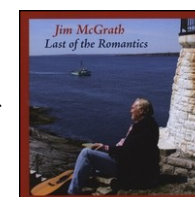


Jim McGrath:

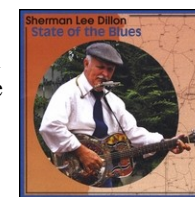


Sherman Lee Dillon:

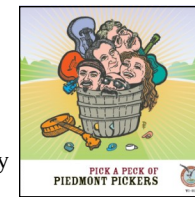


Andy Cohen, Gareth Hedges, Mike Higgins, Russ Mello, & Lauren Sheehan:
